The committee understands the importance of "calling" a minister to NWPC very soon so as to help hold together the works of our church. We are also searching for the best the Lord provides.

Having met twice since last newsletter, we have lots to report. To highlight minutes of meeting results, we decided since one of our primary candidates for fulltime minister is unavailable 'till summer, we should invite another candidate to join us part time. Both persons of interest, Bishop T.J. Johnston happily will preach 3 Sundays through March and Dr. Jim Miller, only first Sunday of each month, so neither willing to "work" part time.

Well, three days prior to our Feb. 9 meeting, we received a fine resume from a young lady living in Hanahan. The committee moved swiftly to invite Rachel Birch to preach on Sunday, Feb. 27. These devices are easy to use and are quite safe. They determine the need of correction of fibrillation and send no electrical impulse unless it detects defibrillation. The machine comes with instructions.

The cost of a suitable tree and of a defibrillator will be no more than \$2000. Please consider making donations to cover the costs.

Our church will reach its 150th anniversary this summer. A significant celebration is being arranged. It is good that officers and other members have been devoted record keepers. Available now are not just official session minutes but an abundance of information about the work and accomplishments of the life of church organizations and about church social life. Here, for example, is an account of the founding of the church, with listing of the first members. (Thanks to Helen Morrison for this).

On Friday, August 23, 1872 an organizational meeting was held to establish New Wappetaw Presbyterian Church in McClellanville. The mother church was located between McClellanville and Mount Pleasant.

building was held June 20, 1875 (located at Pinckney and Scotia Streets)


These first members were mostly from families that had earlier resided around and worshipped at the mother church, Old Wappetaw. The Union Chapel was located at Pinkney and Oak Streets, site of the War Memorial.

From the Session


Budget and Finance – Good donations have been received. Pledges for giving in 2022 exceed \$72,000. Electricity costs increasing. Heating to be reduced except in the sanctuary (protection of the piano). Christian Education – An anonymous donor is making a memorial donation in memory of Lynn Godwin. Funds are to support Youth Christian Education, including the annual trips to Montreat and purchase of arts and crafts.

Cemetery – The cemetery gates have been repaired and made wider. Surrounding bushes have been cleared away to make the entry view improved.
